The spring bunker programme has been completed with the 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup> bunker refurbishments finished. The rest will be completed in the autumn subject to monies being available.

All the new machinery has been delivered and put into use.

The new vibrating rollers were first used on the 27<sup>th</sup> March and an instant improvement in the playing surface resulted.

The fairways have been shaped and in particular the left hand side of the 6<sup>th</sup> cut back to allow more roll for the higher handicapper.

Paths on the 9/10<sup>th</sup> have been renovated and the hedge on the 10<sup>th</sup> tee removed which is to be replaced by a laurel hedge

The practice area has had debris removed and had its first cut. Thanks to David Deighton for paying for the repair and maintenance of the gang mowers.

During week beginning the 31<sup>st</sup> March the greens will be penciled tinned and top-dressed ready for the spring.
